**Step 1: Apply for Child Care Financial Assistance**

To be eligible for assistance your family must:

- 1) Have an accepted service need (reason) for childcare; AND
- 2) Meet current income guidelines (Gross monthly income not to exceed \$5,100 for 3 person family, \$6150 for 4 person family, \$7195 for 5 person family, \$8240 for 6+ person family).

We ask any family that meets the above eligibility requirements to apply for Child Care Financial Assistance before requesting a scholarship. To apply, parents/guardians must contact the Family Place at 802-649-3268 or go to <http://www.familyplacevt.org/child-care/>.

Your camp registration will be considered incomplete until you have submitted a complete application to the Family Place and have signed below OR if you can provide evidence that your family would not be eligible for Child Care Financial Assistance.

# Sharon Summer Camp 2018

Dear Parents/Guardians,

March 20, 2018

We are pleased to announce that Sharon One Planet Summer Camp registration is now open! One Planet, with the support of Sharon Elementary School and the Town of Sharon, is offering a full-day program with rich and varied summer activities for students currently in grades K-6. The program will run June 25 – August 3, 8:30-4:30pm. Childcare will be available one hour before and after the program. If registered by May 1st, \$120/week (\$135/week for swimming lesson weeks) will include fun theme-related activities, field trips, breakfast, lunch, a daily snack, special events, and more! Child care subsidy and scholarships are available.

**LIMITED SPACE:** We do expect to fill all of our available slots this summer, so if you are interested in enrolling your child, **please do not wait!** We will open enrollment to non-residents starting May 1<sup>st</sup>. In addition, if you enroll your child and pay 50% by May 1st, you will get \$5/week off!

**SWIMMING LESSONS:** We will return to Upper Valley Aquatic Center again this year, July 9-20th. ***As in the past, students who enroll for both weeks will be given priority over those who enroll for only one week should we meet our maximum enrollment.***

**LEADERSHIP:** Paul Sadowski will be the Summer Camp Coordinator. Roxana Matthews, the current Site Coordinator, will be handling registration and other administrative duties.

**SHARON SUMMER PROGRAM 2018**  
REGISTRATION DETAILS: *PLEASE Read Carefully*

**REQUIREMENTS FOR PROGRAM:**

Open to children who are **currently completing** K-6<sup>th</sup> grade. Sharon residents have priority until May 1st. **Non-residents cannot receive scholarships.** We consider Sharon residents to be children who live in Sharon year-round or who have families that reside in Sharon year-round.

**REGISTRATION PROCEDURES:**

**Opening:** March 2018

**Ending:** When program has 45 enrolled or June 1st. Forms will be processed in the order they are received.

Drop off or mail registration forms and payment to Roxana Matthews at the Sharon Elementary School, 75 VT RT 132, Sharon, VT 05065.

**REGISTRATION POLICIES:**

1. ***Half of total summer payment must be sent with registration form to secure a spot for your child. The second half of the payment must be received by June 1, 2018.***
2. Registration Forms must be complete. *Participants with incomplete forms will be put on a waiting list and parent/guardian will be notified.*

**CANCELLATION POLICY:** If your child will not be able to attend a week for which he/she is registered, please notify Roxana Matthews as soon as possible so that children on the waiting list can be notified. If cancellation is made by June 2, the camp fee will be returned in full, minus \$25 processing fee. If cancellation is made after that time, we will be unable to issue any refund and families who receive Child Care Financial Assistance will be charged the weekly rate. **PLEASE NOTE: Due to the low fee schedule, we do not provide discounts or refunds for days during which your child doesn't attend camp.**

**SWIMMING LESSONS:** Daily swimming lessons will occur July 9-20th at UVAC. If you do NOT want your child to participate in swimming lessons, please do not enroll him/her for those weeks, as that will be a central piece of our programming. We will give priority to participants who enroll in both weeks of lessons.

**FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE:** If you cannot afford the summer fee, we ask families to first apply for Child Care Assistance through the Family Place, 802-649-3268. Please do this well in advance (by mid-May). If your family does not qualify for state assistance, please refer to the Financial Assistance form for more information.

**BREAKFAST/LUNCH/SNACK:** A healthy breakfast, lunch and an afternoon snack will be provided each day. A menu calendar will be provided at the beginning of the summer.

**ITEMS TO BRING EACH DAY:** Sunscreen & Hat, **SNEAKERS**, Bathing Suit & Towel, Water Bottle, Extra T-Shirts & Shorts, Reading Book, Bag Lunch (only if your child does not want served lunch).

**ADMINISTRATION:** Paul Sadowski will be the Site Coordinator during the summer program. Roxana Matthews will be overseeing registration and fees and fielding questions prior to the summer program. Feel free to contact Paul or Roxana at (802) 763-7425, ext. 18.

**DROP OFF:** Unless your child is attending **Early Bird** or **Night Owl hours**, campers should arrive at 8:30am and picked up between 4:00-4:30pm. Notify Coordinator if your child will be arriving late or leaving early. Also notify Coordinator if your child will not be attending a certain day. This will help us plan ahead.

**PARENT VOLUNTEERS:** We are seeking parent volunteers to act as chaperones on our field trips &

special events. Please let us know if you're willing to help!

**ONE PLANET FIELD TRIPS & SPECIAL EVENTS**

During weeks 3 & 4 participants will travel to the Upper Valley Aquatic Center daily for Swim America swimming lessons. If your child participated in the Swim America program last year, he/she will be placed in the proper level. New participants will be tested on the first day. All students will receive a skills mastered "report card" at the end of the 2 weeks.

During weeks 1, 2, 5 & 6, One Planet will take participants on field trips 1-2x weekly. This is usually a theme-based field trip on Fridays, and sometimes a half-day swimming trip. Please see *Weekly Theme Schedule* below for more information.

On Friday, August 3, we invite all summer participants and their families to join us for a summer's-end pizza party from 12:00-3pm. We will provide lunch & fun activities for the whole family. We will need parent volunteers, so please let us know if you are interested in helping! We will also gladly take food donations. Please help us any way you can with this special event!

**NOTE: Program will end at 3pm on Friday, August 3th.**

Parents will be notified of field trip details each Monday in a Parent Letter available at pick-up.

## **SHARON WEEKLY THEMES**

### **June 25-29: Can You Dig It?**

Students will dig into the past as they delve into some of the greatest mysteries of all time, and explore the connections between the past and present. Archaeology, paleontology, and anthropology, blend to create an excavation of human history. Activities will include creating an excavation site, playing an ancient Mayan game using Mayan math, exploring real places where archeology has been used to decipher the past (such as Pompeii or Neanderthal caves) and much more. Field Trip: Polar Caves; Free Swim (Location TBD)

### **July 2-6: Carnival Week**

Experience a weeklong maker space where children design and create their own carnival games with mostly recycled items. Participants will be encouraged to work together and problem solve to make a successful carnival game. At the end of the week the community is invited to eat, play and have fun as students share their creations! Field Trip: Circus Smirkus (St. Johnsbury) & Magic Performance

### **July 6-13: Theater Production Immersion Camp**

Over the course of the week, students will prepare for a short play or musical with a final performance on Friday. Students be involved all aspects of putting on a show: acting, music, singing, dancing, choreography, lighting, sound, advertising, & costuming. Field Trip: Swim Lessons at UVAC

### **July 16-20: 3-D Art**

This week students are encouraged to get off the page. Students will be provided instruction and support to explore this fun, hands-on type of art through sculpting, pottery, yarn paper arts, 3-D pen art, Wonder Painter animation and more. Students will be introduced to new techniques and tools, so they can take their art to the next level. Field Trip: Swim Lessons at UVAC

### **July 23-27: Vermont Backwoods Pioneers**

During this week-long place-based program, students explore the local natural environment and the recreational activities available around them. Students will use the school grounds as an outdoor classroom for activities such as campfire building, cooking, mapping, orienteering, shelter building and more. In addition, students will be transported to field trip sites where they can do deeper exploration of the natural flora and fauna, as well as recreate. Students will be prompted to think about the relationship between humans and nature and give opportunity learn about stewardship of our natural places.

Field Trip: Local Hike; Free Swim (Location TBD)

### **July 30-August 3: Things that GO!!!!**

Exploring physics, engineering and aesthetic concepts, students will spend the week designing, building and testing all different kinds of "things that go", including cars, boats and rockets. Students will be introduced to scientific processes through the experience of creating a design, making observations, taking notes and adjusting their creations. Field Trip: Killington Adventure Center; Free Swim (Location TBD)

*\*The theme descriptions are intended to give you an idea of potential activities for each theme. We will do our best to make these activities happen, but slight changes may occur between now and June. Regardless of what specific activities are offered, our programming will be of high-quality and enriching.*
