

## **Sharon Principal Report May 11, 2021**

### **Strategic Plan Goal:**

1) The WRVSU will form and sustain a comprehensive MTSS that:

- Utilizes evidence based best practices in instruction
- Utilizes student data to ensure student growth
- Encourages a rigorous, innovative and relevant learning environment
- Encourages the integration of PLP and Flexible Pathways to best meet the needs of all students.
  - **Next Round of reading assessment (local) is taking place.**
  - **June 4 and June 11th teachers will have transition meetings for next year's students.**
  - **On May 7th teachers are meeting with Donna Isaacs to look at student writing samples. This is our first step to using protocols to look at student work and eventually student data.**

2) WRVSU will implement a PK-12 Proficiency Based Learning System.

WRVSU school will utilize a comprehensive approach to ensure relevancy, rigor, and personalization. This will be achieved through the following:

- Curriculum
- Instruction
- Assessment
  - **Our year long math course is not complete. Teachers have been asked to reflect on their learning and to identify changes that they will make based on new learning.**
  - **We will look to continue our math development next year, possibly with the same instructor we worked with this past year.**
  - **Sharon will pilot a new assessment program called Track My Progress, a possible replacement for STAR 360.**
  - **We will be working with John Kidde a well known consultant that helps schools develop restorative practices that center around student behavior.**

3) The WRVSU will improve student learning and increase equitable educational opportunities through the development of a culture that promotes interdependence among all stakeholders and enhances student achievement, choice and voice.
